Defence Production and Export Promotion Policy 2020 Defence Park in Kerala to Promote MSMEs and Boost 'Make in India' Initiative

- Growing demand: Till March 2025, a total of 700 industrial licenses were issued to 436 companies operating in the defence sector. Annual defence production reached a record Rs. 1,50,590 crore (US\$ 17.57 billion) in FY25, up 18% from Rs. 1,27,000 crore (US\$ 14.28 billion) in FY24 and 90% from FY20. India's defence exports have witnessed a remarkable surge, growing from Rs. 686 crore (US\$ 81.1 million) in FY14 to Rs. 23,622 crore (US\$ 2.8 billion) in FY25, marking an 34% increase
- Competitive advantage: India intends to deploy a constellation of 52 satellites over the next five years to enhance space-based surveillance for the Army, Navy, and Air Force, facilitating enemy tracking, border monitoring, and improved real-
- Government support: The Union Budget for FY26 envisaged an outlay of Rs. 6,81,000 crore (US\$ 78.7 billion), represents
  an enhancement of 9.5% over the Budget of FY25. Under the Atmanirbhar Bharat Initiative, five positive indigenization
  lists of 509 products have been promulgated by the Department of Military Affairs and Ministry of Defence to be
  manufactured domestically for the defence sector, instead of being sourced via imports.
- Opportunities: As of February 2025, 549 problem statements have been opened, involving 619 startups and MSMEs, with 430 iDEX contracts signed.
