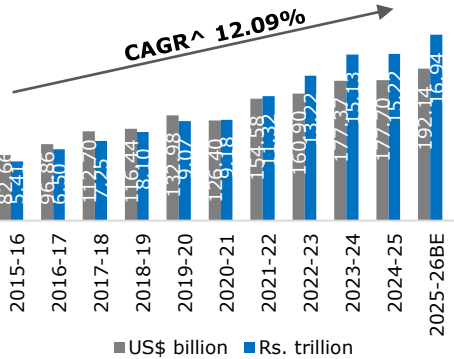


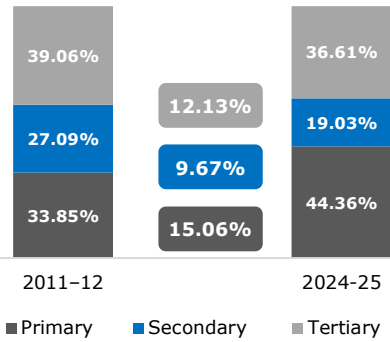

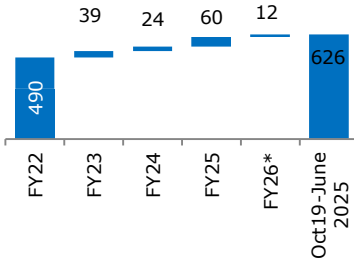
GSDP of Madhya Pradesh at Current Prices

## ADVANTAGES



**Strategically located business hub**

Centrally located state in India. Major consumer goods multinationals are situated in Madhya Pradesh in order to access major consumer markets and metro urban communities.

State has a well-developed automotive cluster and is home to around 30 auto component and ancillary units.



**Rich resource pool**

At labour costs of US\$ 3.7 per day, the state has a significant cost advantage over metros.

The state houses some of the country's most reputed institutes including Indian Institute of Management, Indian Institute of Foreign Management and Indian Institute of Technology.



**Attractive investment avenues**

Madhya Pradesh Industrial Development Corporation (MPIDC) has emerged as the leading investment promotion agency worldwide. In the field of investment promotion, the state scored 97%.



**Policy and infrastructure support**

Union Minister of Road Transport and Highways Mr. Nitin Gadkari announced over Rs. 60,000 crore (US\$ 6.80 billion) worth of new road and highway projects in Madhya Pradesh, including a Rs. 15,000 crore (US\$ 1.70 billion), 255 km Greenfield Highway between Bhopal and Jabalpur, a wildlife corridor linking major tiger reserves, several expressways, and the state's longest flyover in Jabalpur, marking a major infrastructure boost.

## KEY GOVERNMENT POLICIES AND OBJECTIVES



**Expressway**

Proposed expressway network will be built over the next five years.



**Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana (PMGKAY)**

The central government has extended the Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana (PMGKAY) for an additional five years, effective January 1, 2024. The scheme ensures food security by providing 5 kg of free monthly food grains to 81 crore beneficiaries.



**Mukhyamantri Sahkari Dugdh Utpadak Protsahan Scheme**

Madhya Pradesh has partnered with the National Dairy Development Board (NDDB) on a five-year plan to expand its dairy infrastructure. The initiative will establish new village collection centers, boost processing capacity, and aims to double farmers' annual income.



**Prison Reforms**

Madhya Pradesh announced a special 60-day remission of sentences for around 14,000 eligible prisoners, under the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS) guidelines, as a reformative step to reward good behavior and support reintegration efforts.

Develop the transportation network to enhance rural connectivity and reform the institutional machinery.



**Agriculture**

Expand the outreach of agriculture technology and irrigation to remote farms and promote farm level diversification.



**Tourism**

**Infrastructure**

Connect all villages through world class highways and be a leader in renewable energy and green technology.



**Investment promotion**

Enhance the ease of doing business for the benefit of investors and attract higher investments.



**Skill development**

Skill development by expanding training infrastructure and capacity to aid 1 million youth.



**Housing**

Improve civic infrastructure and expand availability of affordable housing.



**Environment**

Promote social and agro forestry and revitalise ground water resources.
