

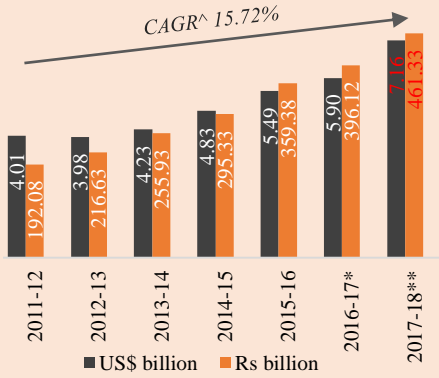

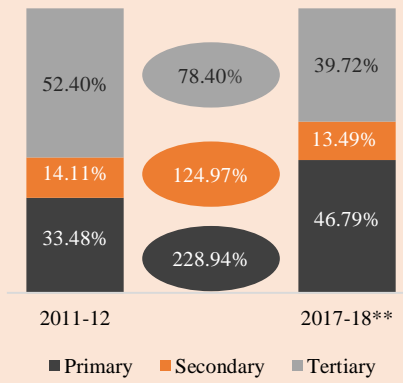

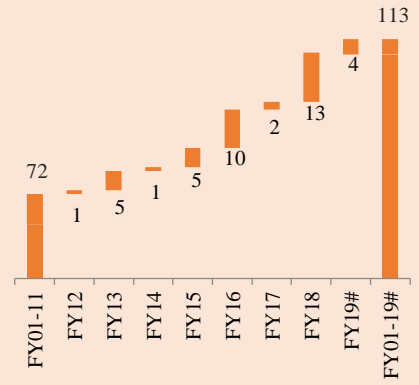
GSDP of Tripura at current prices

## Advantages

### Tourism hub in North East

- Blessed with scenic beauty, ancient places, temples, breathing taking verdant hills & bio-diversity treasure trove of wildlife sanctuaries

### Untapped resources and medical plants

- 266 medicinal plants, 379 species of trees, 581 herbs, 320 shrubs & 165 climbers.
- Tripura has several potential sectors such as organic spices, bio-fuels & eco-tourism.

### Availability of skilled workforce

- Tripura has a large base of skilled labour, making it an ideal destination for knowledge sectors. At 87.8 per cent, its literacy rate is higher than the national average rate.
